

Our first bees were installed in 2016 in three locations at the Farley Center by Patrick Norby and Dan Hedctke. The goals were to provide pollination for the crops grown at the Farley Center, educate Farley Center visitors on honeybees, and provide a habitat for honeybees to thrive. The Farley Center's Beekeeper Incubator

Pilot Program was launched in 2017 and continues to grow. The program was designed to promote small-scale, sustainable beekeeping by providing an environment and guidance to learn beekeeping.
